








Above: Scott O'Hern sets play for a score. Below: Jeff Camarigg goes up for the ball.






Beginning their season by losing three of their first four games, the Junior Varsity Girls Basketball Team outscored their opponents by an incredible 145 points in their last seven outings to turn all seven into victories. Those seven and four earlier victories brought their record up to a superb 11-5 showing. Led by Lisa Knauer, the offense scored 852 total points while the defense held their sixteen foes to 671 points. Standouts included Lisa Knauer and Colleen Blankenburg on offense and Beckie Kots, Cathy Walton, and Terri Gemmill on defense. Also credited with fine performances were offensive players Rhonda Andresen and Tammy Huseth, and defensive players Linda Benson, Linda Eybers, and Lynn Jensen.

Led by junior Joe Gormally, the Raider wrestlers suffered only one loss en route to a second place finish in the Sioux Interstate Conference. They took first at our Invitational, at Spencer, and at Sectionals. They earned a fifth-place in the Ames Tournament and finished seventh in a sixteen-team field at Districts.

98 POUNDS — Surprising sophomore Gary Freese (20-6) wrestled the 98-pound weight class for the Raiders. He took second-place in the East Invitational, third in the SIC Tournament, and fifth at Ames. Gary won first at Sectionals, but was eliminated from state-wide chances at Districts — maybe next year.

105 POUNDS — Winning second-place laurels in the Spencer and East Invitational Tournaments, third-place at Ames, and fourth-place in the Conference Tournament. Another sophomore, Jim Corey (14-8-2) finished second at sectionals. Also eliminated at Districts, Jim will try for state again next winter.

112 POUNDS — Senior Martin Miille (19-9) ended his Raider career with three school records. Martin now holds the twopoint near fall record with 43, the season back-point record with 193 points. He also took first-place honors in the Spencer Tournament, second-place honors in the East Invitational and SIC Tournaments, and fifth-place honors in the Ames Tourney. Finally, he earned a second at sectionals and a fourth at Districts.

119 POUNDS — Junior Scott Wilcox (19-9) tied the East

reversal record with 34. He was awarded first-place at our Invitational, third-place in the Spencer and Conference Tourneys, and sixth-place at Ames. Scott lost at Sectionals, but returns to the mats for another chance next year.

126 POUNDS — Another junior, John Rice (14-12-1) improved considerably during the season — from a fifth-place finish at Sectionals before finally succumbing at Districts. Returning next season, John will have another chance to test his improved skills.


132 POUNDS — Mike Lester (11-3) and Ron Benson (5-9) ended their Raider careers this year. Mike, a senior, began this year in this position with a first-place finish at Spencer and a third-place finish in the East Invitational. Ron took over after Mike suffered a mid-season back injury. Also a senior, Ron earned fourth-place laurels in the SIC Tournament and finished third at Sectionals.

138 POUNDS — On the tournament trail, junior Jeff Forbes (19-10) won firsts in both the Spencer and East Invitational Tourneys, second at SIC, and fourth at Ames. Although he finished third at Sectionals, Jeff took Bob Moore's (North High) place at Districts after Bob came down with a fever. Jeff then qualified for state by earning second-place at Districts. Unfortunately, Jeff was eliminated in first-round action in the State Tournament.

145 POUNDS - Junior Jon Walker (15-8-2) won first at

East, third at SIC, and sixth at Ames. Jon, who will return for his final season next year, finished Sectionals with secondplace but lost at Districts.

155 POUNDS — Senior Tim Wilson (17-6) finished his wrestling career at East with second-place awards in the East Invitational and SIC Tournamants, a third-place award at Spencer, and a fourth-place award at Ames. An injury just prior to Sectionals prevented Tim from vying for state honors. Replacement Jim Burkette captured second at Sectionals, but was eliminated at Districts.

167 POUNDS — Junior Joe Gormally (31-2) led the team with an outstanding record of only two losses, and his 63 takedowns broke the previous school record. Spencer, Ames, East, SIC, and finally Sectionals all gave Joe first-place laurels, and the junior wrestler over came tough opposition at Districts and state to claim third-place in Iowa.

185 POUNDS — Senior Ron Hummel (18-9-2) ended his final season at East with a second at SIC and thirds at Spencer, East, and Ames. He took second-place at Sectionals and fourth-place at Districts. Ron also broke the record for season three-point near falls with 22.

HEAVYWEIGHT — Marvin Harrington (18-6-1), a junior, was the big man on the team. Marvin began the season with nine straight victories, grabbed first-place in the Spencer Tournament, second-place in the SIC Tournament, and fourthplace at both the Ames and East Invitational Tournaments.








